## PROJECT SUMMARY

In 2014, the Pheasant Run Homeowner's Association (HOA) received an award to conduct community projects to address environmental issues such as erosion, stormwater runoff, and pet waste pollution within the community.

Dog Walking Stations were put in areas with high traffic where dogs being walked. This increases the amount of pet waste being picked up, which decreases the amount of polluted runoff that flows into local waterways.

The community area, Fort Pheasant, now has signage implemented to point out native species and increase resident's awareness of the impact of stormwater runoff on our environment.

Six rain barrels were distributed throughout the community. Rain barrels collect stormwater that would otherwise run off of roofs, carrying pollutants into storm drains and rivers. Residents can reuse the collected water to water flowering plants and trees.

A Little Free Library containing books and educational materials on environmental topics was placed near a bus stop in the community. A Little Free Library is a "take a book, return a book" free book exchange. It aims to inspire reading, build community, and increase access to books for readers of all ages and backgrounds.
