Pooled Monitoring Initiative & Restoration Research Award Program



- Key restoration research was needed and is delivered through this program
- Pooled Monitoring Advisory Committee
 - Formed in 2014 to determine if and how restoration practices perform
 - Use an award program to pool resources and answer restoration questions that could not be answered by site specific monitoring
 - Many partners in this Initiative











Research/Monitoring Process: Proposed Advisory Panel (AP) Information disseminated constituted: to all groups AP - polls these communities on Agency repsgo backto priority research needs agencies -training of permit review staffoccurs regulators academics? MS4s practitioners Agency repsand AP meet again to get consensus on the feedback AP - leads development of prioritized research questions list Agency rep takes info back to agency and AP: leads review of existing literature to gets input/feedback from their staff determine if answer exists OR if data exist that could be further analyzed to answer AP meets with 1 individual from AP prepares and sends out a call for proposals to answer each agency to communicate questions: either new research (consistent protocols results and encouraged) or new analysis recommendations/interpretations AP reviews proposals and potentially along with review from additional experts AP interprets answers into application recommendations (particular to permitting) Research conducted: answers obtained
