All-Hands on Deck Project Day



Year 1 Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What is the Corps All-Hands on Deck Contest?

A: The All-Hands on Deck (AHD) event is a project day in the Spring during the service term planned by and hosted by MCC Fellows. Fellows apply to host the whole cohort for a project day on behalf of their host site partner in mid-February. There are a wide range of eligible project day activities. Q: How much funding can be requested for the AHD Contest?

A: The AHD Contest accepts requests up to \$2,000.

Q: What is required to apply for the AHD Contest?

A: The application for the AHD Contest must be submitted through the Trust's online system at https://www.grantrequest.com/SID_1520?SA=SNA&FID=35182. The application includes submitting the online application form, narrative form, and application budget tab in the Financial Management Spreadsheet. Q: When will I hear back about my application to host an AHD project day?

A: The application to host an AHD project day is due in mid-February and applicants will receive notification about whether they have been selected by mid-March. The AHD project day will be held at the end of April so the selected Fellow will have sufficient time to organize and prepare for their event.

Q: How are AHD project days selected?

A: Proposals will be reviewed and selected by a combination of Trust staff and objective MCC Fellows (Fellows who have not applied to host an AHD project event).

Q: What reporting will I have to do for the AHD award?

A: After the AHD project day takes place, the Fellow who hosted the project day will be required to submit a final report and photos from the event. The final report form can be found at <https://cbtrust.org/maryland-climate-corps/current/all-hands-on-deck/>.

Q: How many attendees should I plan for?

A: The cohort is made up of ~40 MCC Fellows so along with the Trust's Corps team and DSCI staff, you should plan for ~45 attendees.
