
What On Earth Are You Doing For Earth Day (April 22nd)?

How much do you know about the food on your plate?

The Lower Eastern Shore Engagement Network (LESEN) recently held a screening of 'Eating Animals' in Berlin, MD. Guests participated in a post screening discussion about diversifying agriculture on Delmarva and supporting small farm independent farmers. The film charts how farming has gone from local and sustainable to a corporate Frankenstein monster. Cheap eggs, meat, and dairy are offered at a steep



cost: the exploitation of animals; the risky use of antibiotics and hormones; and the pollution of our air, soil, and water. LESEN partners in attendance were <u>Future Harvest CASA</u>, <u>Socially Responsible Agricultural Project</u>, <u>Assateague Coastal Trust</u>, and <u>Surfrider Foundation</u>.



Project Highlight: East Branch Stream Buffer Planting Project

The Howard County Conservancy received a grant award to plant 355 trees along East Branch Stream at their Mt. Pleasant location in Woodstock, MD. Over 140 volunteers participated in the tree planting which covered 1.19 acres of land that was previously used for agriculture. Planting trees along streams protects the stream from erosion, decreases water pollution, and improves habitat for wildlife and aquatic species.
