Harmful Algal Blooms: ShoreRivers Awareness Project Seeks to Inform Pet Owners of Possible Risks

For pet owners, the health and happiness of our four-legged friends is a top priority. For many, time spent by our local rivers or shorelines is a great way to end a work day or relax on the weekend. But the next time you venture out with your pet, our friends at ShoreRivers ask that we be more aware of the seemingly unmenacing, yet potentially dangerous presence of algal blooms.

The Chesapeake Bay Trust recently awarded a grant to ShoreRivers to help educate pet owners about the health impacts that algal blooms can have on our pets and livestock. As algal blooms in the watershed continue to grow at a greater pace and with higher toxicity levels (largely due to stormwater runoff) ShoreRivers has implemented algae and water monitoring equipment that can efficiently test for harmful algal blooms in our local waterways. These new monitoring tools help to quickly assess the safety of a body of water and could provide life saving measures for pets.


