## Green Streets, Green Jobs, Green Towns

**Program Summary:** The Green Streets, Green Jobs, Green Towns Grant Program is designed to support the planning, design, and implementation of green streets; community greening projects; and urban tree canopy projects that enhance livability in cities and communities, in addition to white papers and tools that address green infrastructure topics.

**Eligible Project Locations:** This program funds projects within the Chesapeake Bay watershed portions of Delaware, Maryland, Pennsylvania, Washington, D.C., West Virginia, and Virginia.

**Request Amounts:**

Track 1: Conceptual Plans (up to \$20,000)

Track 2: Engineered Designs (up to \$35,000)

Track 3: Construction/Implementation (up to \$175,000)

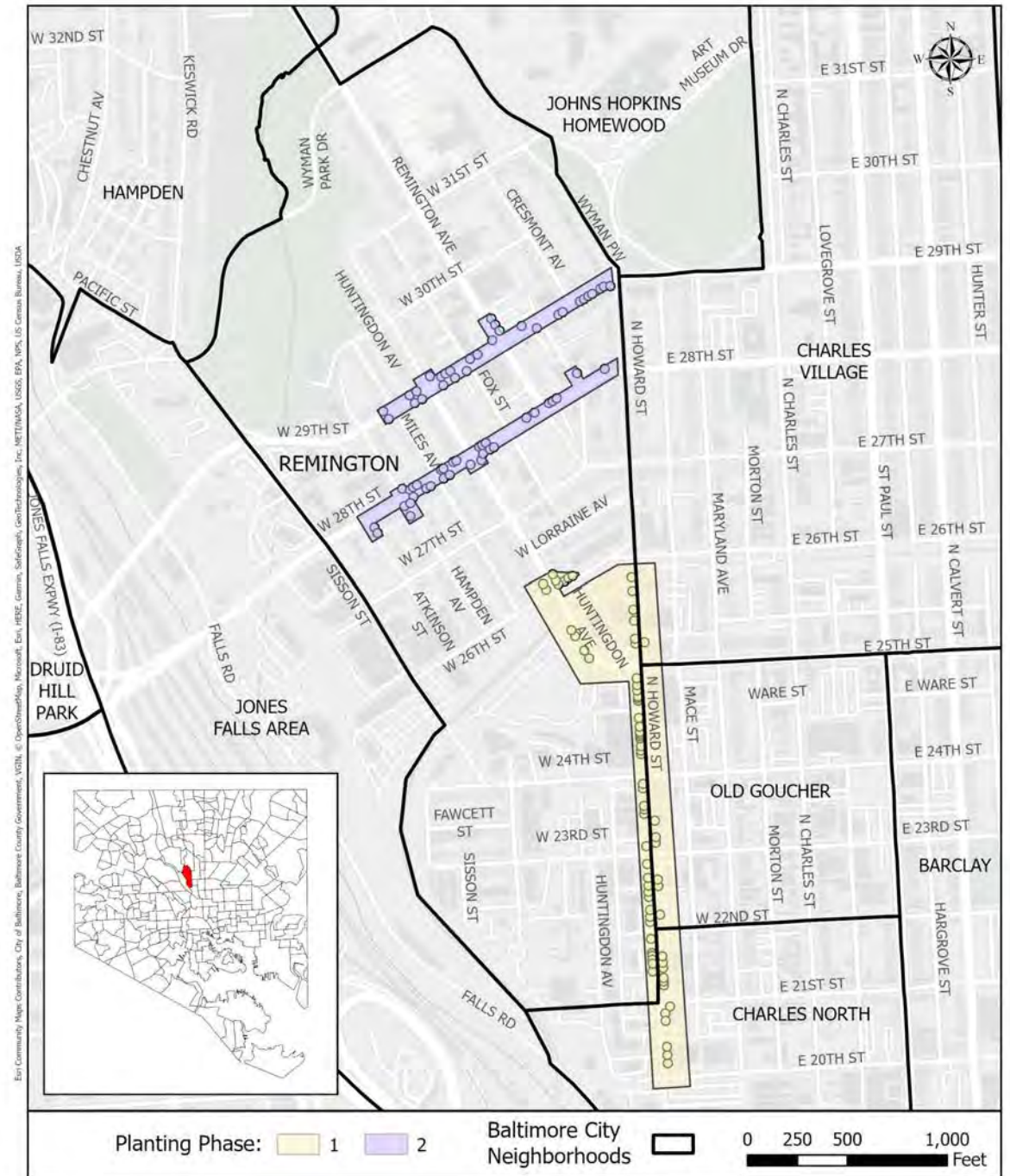
Track 4: Community Greening (up to \$50,000)

Track 5: White Papers and Tool Development (up to \$20,000)

Track 6: Charrettes/Technical Assistance (no direct funding)

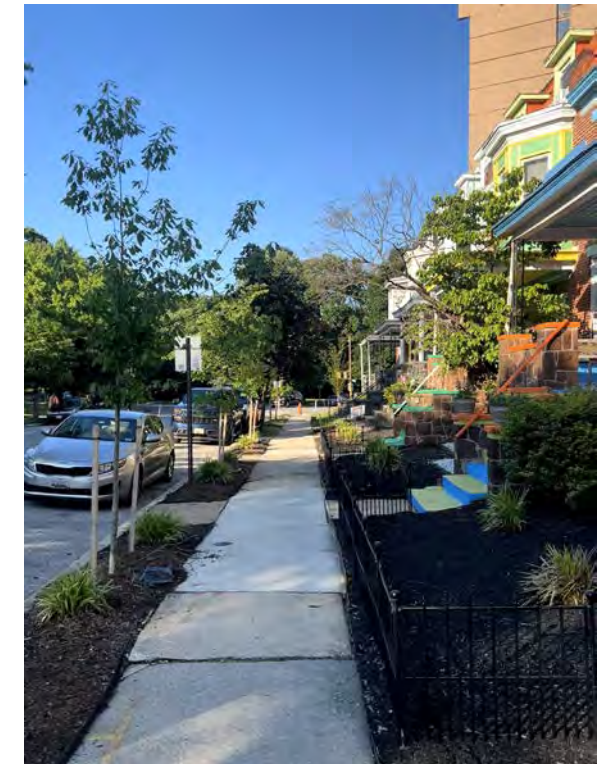
## Greater Remington Improvement Association

- ▶ Location: Remington, Baltimore MD
- ▶ Grant Program Name: Chesapeake Bay Trust, Green Streets, Green Jobs, Green Towns (G3)
- ▶ Project Name: Remington Greening Project
- ▶ Amount Awarded: \$50,340



# Greater Remington Improvement Association

- ▶ 132 native trees planted
- ▶ 5,200 square feet of concrete removal (In-Kind Support from Spiniello Companies)
- ▶ Over 100 native perennials planted through a volunteer event in June 2024
- ▶ Maintenance of Trees (watering, weeding, mulching) being completed by non-profit employing neighborhood residents for first 2 years of warm weather
- ▶ Connection with Baltimore City Forestry Department (new processes for permitting, fire hydrant usage)





## Prince George's County Stormwater Stewardship

**Program Summary:** The Stormwater Stewardship Grant Program funds on-the-ground restoration activities that improve communities, improve water quality, support the County's Climate Action plan, and engage Prince George's County residents in the restoration and protection of the local rivers and streams of Prince George's County.

**Eligible Project Locations:** Prince George's County, Maryland, excluding the City of Bowie

**Request amounts are generally:**

Track 1: Water Quality Implementation (\$50,000 to \$150,000)

Track 2: Tree Canopy: Outreach, Education, Maintenance, and Preservation (\$50,000 to \$300,000)

Track 3: Community Awareness and Engagement (\$10,000 to \$60,000)

Track 4: Illegal Dumping Data Analysis and Forensics (\$10,000 to \$50,000)

Track 5: Piloting a Co-Payment System for Stormwater Management and Residential Resilience Retrofit Program Projects in the Henson Creek Watershed (up to \$1 million)

# Global Health and Education Project, Inc. (GHEP)

**Mission:** To eliminate health disparities by addressing the Social Determinants of Health (SDOH).

**Location:** Riverdale, Maryland, (est.2011).

**Program:** Family Tree Adoption Program (FTAP).

**History:** GHEP piloted the Family Tree Adoption Program in 2015 using a small pilot grant from the Chesapeake Bay Trust (CBT), and subsequently by Prince George's County Department of the Environment (DoE).

**Impact:** Over 755 trees planted in private properties.
