




2018 Treasure the Chesapeake a Success!

The Trust's 20th Annual Treasure the Chesapeake celebration was held on Thursday, May 17, 2018, at the Baltimore Museum of Industry. More than 400 corporations, businesses, and individuals participated in this year's event, helping to raise over \$110,000 in support of the Trust's work to engage hundreds of thousands of students, citizens, and volunteers in hands-on projects for cleaner, greener, healthier watersheds throughout the region.

The third annual Chesapeake Bay Awareness Week kicked off on Saturday, June 2 and runs through Saturday, June 9. In 2016, the Chesapeake Bay Commission championed the idea of designating a week in June as Chesapeake Bay Awareness Week. Legislation establishing the special week was enacted in Maryland, Virginia, and Pennsylvania.

The Chesapeake Bay Trust and Anne Arundel Watershed Protection and Restoration Program recently announced three grant awards to nonprofits in Anne Arundel county. The Alliance for the Chesapeake Bay and the South River Federation will be conducting these projects, which aim to improve local water quality in the Severn and South River watersheds, as well as engage local communities in water quality issues. - Maryland Announces First State-Led Climate Leadership Academy: At the
 inaugural Maryland State of the Coast Conference, leaders from several state
 agencies announced the creation of the first Climate Leadership Academy in the
 country. This program will help non-profits, local governments, regulators, and
 other state agencies to tackle the complex issues of climate change and

- ShoreRivers and St. Michaels Students Complete Environmental Project: Students from St. Michaels Middle High School recently completed a project that mitigates erosion and runoff problems on their school grounds. This project, funded by the Chesapeake Bay Trust, allowed students to identify a local environmental problem, propose potential solutions, and then implement the strongest proposal so that they could see the impacts of their decision. ShoreRivers will continue to manage this Students for Streams program throughout other Eastern Shore schools. You can learn more about the great work these students are doing here.
- Fairfax City Students Help Protect Bay: Chesapeake Bay Awareness week runs from June 2nd-9th this year, but students from Fairfax High School, Lanier Middle School, Daniels Run Elementary School, and Providence Run Elementary School are involved with protecting and restoring the Bay year round. From studying water quality, to installing water bottle filling stations, and recreating aquatic ecosystems, these students are learning about real world issues in a hands-on way. - Bivalve Bipartisanship? Environmentalists, Watermen Have a Meeting of the Minds: After several rounds of discussion, a group of 16 stakeholders has created a vision and goals for the restoration of oysters in two Eastern Shore rivers. The group, OysterFutures, laid out a list of recommendations for restoring the natural stock of oysters in the Bay while also supporting the communities and industries that depend on them. The success of this project could determine how future restoration efforts work to engage a variety of stakeholders to achieve measureable successes. You can read more about this work here.
