- \$40 can plant 4 native trees to improve air and water quality

Partners Preserve Scenic Land on Little Patuxent

Recently, Scenic Rivers Land Trust closed on a conservation easement to permanently protect 111 acres in Anne Arundel County. Partnering with Maryland Environmental Trust and working with grant funding through the Chesapeake Bay Trust's Anne Arundel County Forestry and Forested Land Protection Grant Program, Scenic

Rivers was able to help the property owner protect land that has been in her family for more than 100 years from development, while conserving vital forested land, wetlands, and green space in Anne Arundel County.

Scenic Rivers Land Trust is a 501c3 nonprofit dedicated to protecting forests, wetlands, farmlands and other open spaces in Anne Arundel County. Since 1988, Scenic Rivers has used land conservation easements to protect special places from development and provide tax incentives to property owners.
