

Earlier this month, the Trust was joined by friends, supporters, and Maryland legislators to celebrate our 2019 scholarship and award winners at our Annual


Legislative Reception and Awards Program held at the Maryland General Assembly. During the event, more than 150 environmental leaders and Maryland legislators came together to honor remarkable individuals and organizations for their outstanding contributions to environmental education, watershed restoration, and volunteerism.

Awards are made each year to two students for environmental and community leadership, to one educator for excellence in environmental education, to one business for green efforts, to one organization for a notable watershed stewardship project, and to one community leader or volunteer who goes routinely above and beyond in improving the streams, rivers, parks, forests, or other natural resource within our watershed.

This year, the Trust honored <u>Green Streets</u>, <u>Green Towns</u>, <u>Green Jobs grant program</u> awardee <u>Frederick Food Security Network</u> with the Melanie Teems Award for exceptional grant work for their innovative approach to addressing stormwater runoff and food insecurity in Frederick County. The Trust also honored long-time partner and former Trust board member, Stuart Clarke, executive director of the <u>Town Creek Foundation</u>, with the Ellen Fraites Wagner Award for his influential impact on grant-making in the Chesapeake environmental community.

Project Highlight: Going Green in Greektown

This autumn, with the help of a Trust <u>Outreach and Restoration Grant</u>, <u>Blue Water Baltimore</u> wrapped up a large-scale project and planted 215 trees on 1.2 miles of streets in southeast Baltimore's Greektown neighborhood. Greektown is one of the most diverse neighborhoods in Baltimore, but it's also one of the least leafy with only an 8 percent tree canopy. This led the <u>Greater Greektown Neighborhood Alliance</u> to find out who in their neighborhood wanted to steward a new tree; they ultimately requested that Blue Water Baltimore plant trees in front of over 170 homes.
