



Prince George's County Community Resilience Hub Information Session 2.11.26 Questions and Answers

1. Do applicants need to have a Limited Liability Company (LLC) or 501c3?
 - a. No, applicants are not required to hold 501c3 status, however organizations must be not-for-profit. Eligible applicants listed on our website include nonprofit organizations, faith-based organizations, watershed organizations, Prince George's County municipalities, homeowners associations, community organizations, and public and independent higher education institutions. If your organization does not fit into one of these categories, please reach out to the program lead. Entities may partner with a nonprofit as a fiscal sponsor for their project.

2. Please clarify a public higher education institution. Are elementary, middle, and high schools eligible to apply?
 - a. Public higher educational institutions are public colleges or universities. Elementary, middle, and high schools are eligible to apply to the program, as they fall under the not-for-profit category.

3. Can funds be used to support projects for community members (Ex. Assisting seniors at their homes)?
 - a. This depends on the services that will be provided to community members, which must have a connection to climate resilience. This could be supported through a mobile resilience hub and we encourage you to reach out to the program lead to discuss your project further and confirm eligibility.

4. Do educational awareness campaigns, as part of a larger resilience plan, qualify for funding?
 - a. Yes, educational workshops focusing on climate preparedness, response, and relief are eligible.

5. Is indirect an eligible expense?
 - a. Yes, indirect is an eligible expense. The indirect rate for the program allows up to 20% of the direct costs.
