

Prince George's County organizations are encouraged to apply to the Chesapeake Bay Trust's open grant programs listed below.

Outreach and Restoration Grant Program

The <u>Outreach and Restoration Grant Program</u> encourages outreach and community engagement activities that increase stewardship ethic of natural resources and on-the-ground restoration activities that demonstrate restoration techniques and engage Maryland citizens in the restoration and protection of the Chesapeake Bay and its rivers. This grant program funds projects in partner areas as well as throughout Maryland.

Deadline: August 4, 2020 at 4:00 pm EDT

Watershed Assistance Grant Program

The <u>Watershed Assistance Grant Program</u> will support watershed restoration project design assistance, watershed planning, and programmatic development associated with protection and restoration programs and projects that lead to improved water quality in the Maryland portion of the Chesapeake Bay watershed, the Maryland portion of the Youghiogheny watershed, and the Maryland Coastal Bays.

Working with Faith-Based Organizations to Implement Stormwater Solutions



In 2015, <u>Anacostia Riverkeeper</u> received an award through the <u>Prince George's Stormwater Stewardship Grant Program</u> to carry out their High-Volume Community Cistern project. This project engaged and formed relationships with three faith-based organizations, encouraged members of faith-based organizations to participate in <u>Prince George's County Rain Check Rebate Program</u>, and installed a high-volume cistern on the property to address the stormwater needs of each

participating organization. Anacostia Riverkeeper was able to hold five outreach events in English and Spanish in partnership with the <u>Interfaith Partners for the Chesapeake</u>, which engaged over 170 members of the faith-based organizations that participated in this project.

The Prince George's Stormwater Stewardship Grant Program funds impactful projects that improve neighborhoods, improve water quality in the County's waterways, and engage County residents in stormwater issues.
