Plants, Produce, and Pollinators



Did you know that June 22nd through 28th is recognized as <u>National Pollinators Week</u>? This week celebrates the essential role that pollinators play in the ecosystem and in our daily lives. Pollinators are creatures such as bees, birds, bats, and butterflies that help transfer pollen from plant to plant, which helps plants reproduce. The Chesapeake Bay region is home to over <u>2,700 plant species</u> including flowering plants, of which an estimated 75% rely on pollinators to aid with reproduction. Thus, pollinators play a major role in sustaining the beautiful native plants that fill the scenery, and even the food that makes it to our table!

Around one third of every bite of food we eat would not be possible without the important work carried out by pollinators. The next time you grow fruits or veggies in your garden, keep an eye out for pollinators. Don't have enough space to garden in your own home? Not a problem! Prince George's County offers five community gardens, located in Cherry Hill, Walker Mill, Prince George's Sports and Learning Complex, Watkins Regional Park, and Old Landover Hills. County residents may also able to participate in local community gardens, depending on where you reside in the County. The plants and produce grown in these gardens rely heavily on the work done by pollinators. Let's take this week to learn more about these special creatures!


Welcoming the New Rain Check Rebate Team



The <u>Rain Check Rebate Program</u> is a partnership between <u>Prince George's County Department of the Environment</u> and the <u>Chesapeake Bay Trust</u>. This program offers incentives to homeowners, businesses, and others to install practices that will reduce stormwater runoff quantity, reduce pollution, and improve the water quality of local streams and rivers.

At the beginning of this year, the Chesapeake Bay Trust, in partnership with Prince George's County, welcomed Nguyen Le as the new Rain Check Rebate Coordinator! The Trust recently also welcomed Emma Cwalinski, the summer programmatic intern who will be working as part of the Rain Check Rebate team. Welcome to the team, Emma!

Parkdale Schools the Neighborhood on Stormwater Management



Schools play a huge role in not only educating their students, but also in acting as a center for resources and a vehicle for change and improvement in their communities. The <u>Prince George's County Stormwater Stewardship Program</u> recognizes the potential that these institutions have to engage the community and implement projects that improve the water quality of local waterways.

Parkdale High School, located in Riverdale, received a grant in 2015 to provide impactful learning opportunities and hands-on engagement for Parkdale High School students and teachers in environmental stewardship and stormwater management. Parkdale worked with several partners on this project, including the Anacostia Watershed Society (AWS) and the William S. Schmidt Outdoor Education Center to bring a variety of hands-on activities with an environmental focus to Parkdale students and teachers. The school was also able to address the stormwater management needs of their campus by installing a series of permeable surfaces that allow water to infiltrate into the ground while filtering out pollutants.

Parkdale successfully installed a functional and educational stormwater management practice, while also engaging their community in stewardship. Congratulations to Parkdale High School on an exemplary project!


